PROGRESS ASSOCIATION President's Report

The next monthly General Meetings is on Wednesday 19th November The Seaforth Bowls Club at 7.30pm.

Seaforth to Mt Ossa Rd - The petition, to have the 8km of gravel road sealed, is now closed, Thank you for all your positive support. Glen is collating all the information collected and our aim is to have our submission to our local Minister for him to present to Parliament at the last sitting of October 2014. This is a high priority campaign and will continue until a successful outcome is achieved. We will keep you informed of all outcomes.

Surveillance Camera and light at Victor Creek Boat Ramp - This project to install a security camera on the light pole at the boat ramp is in conjunction with Seaforth Boating Club. We are still waiting on Council to sort out final approvals. Representatives of the Boating Club have been attempting to get this finalised with Jason Frost (Mackay Council) for some weeks. The Boating Club has everything ready to have this project completed.

Beach Erosion Sub Committee - Stage 1 of this work has been completed. Additional stabilising and regeneration work is yet to be finalised. Further stages of this project won't start until the end of the wet season. We will keep you informed.

Sunday Markets - The usual Markets are still held each Sunday. Our **next Mega Markets** are on **Sunday 2nd November and 7th December.**

Fire Season is Here

Like it, or not, we are right in the middle of the fire season, so don't even light a small fire! You must have a permit. If you need to replace battery charges for your mobile devices, and especially cordless phones, always purchase from your dealer. The cheap generic charges don't pass Australian Standards, and have been known to catch fire when nobody is at home .

The fire on Thursday 16th October started, most likely, by a cigarette. It started very small, but with 15 knots of S/E winds it quickly jumped the road near Seaforth Pines and became an out of control wild fire which started near the Bow Hunters field.

Four hours of back burning was required to protect houses in the Johnson Avenue area. We quickly radioed Fire Com for assistance. Four Urban Fire Trucks, and nine Rural Trucks were used, with some Rural crews returning home at 1.00 am on Friday 17th October.



We would like to extend our thanks and appreciation to the QCWA Seaforth Branch for supplying us with sandwiches and the Seaforth Bowls Club for their pizzas, which all helped feed the many fire people combating the blaze. Thanks also to Don Smith for his assistance with a grader to push fire breaks.

Hello all,

Up until the day before I wrote this article, Seaforth had been relatively quiet with plenty of people out enjoying the fantastic weather. Unfortunately, offenders have again decided to steal a large amount of property from the Cape Hillsborough Resort. The Resort has been targeted by offenders over the past few months. The result is that Ben and Renee are now installing a large amount of security cameras throughout the resort to combat and reduce these offences.

If anyone has any information in relation to offences being committed at the Resort, please let me know or you can provide information anonymously through Crimestoppers on 1800 333 000. We have had Scenes of Crime Officers attend and gather evidence left behind by the offenders and I have been in contact with the detectives who are assisting. Hopefully with this evidence and your assistance we can identify these offenders and put them before the Court. So take this as another reminder to lock up your vehicles, houses and property and keep an eye out for each other.

The other event was the fires around Seaforth. Now there were some rumours going around town that these were out of control burns but that's not the truth. The original fire was likely started by a cigarette butt being thrown out the window of a vehicle along the Yakapari-Seaforth Rd. I will remind you all that it is an offence to litter but it's even more stupid to throw a cigarette butt out the window as the end result can mean a large amount of property loss and even worse a loss of life due to these fires.

Seaforth and surrounding suburbs are lucky enough to have an amazing crew of rural fire brigade members that worked tirelessly overnight and following days to ensure these fires didn't get out of control and I would like to pass on my thanks to all of those who assisted in whatever way they could to bring these fires under control and keep the community safe. Coastcare Turtle Talk and Beach Walk

Turtle season is upon us again – RSVP now to secure your spot on a Turtle Talk and Beach Walk to find out more about these unique marine creatures and their nesting cycle.

It's that time of year again, when marine turtles make the trek from the water to the sand dunes to lay their eggs. It is during this time that the female turtles are vulnerable to disturbances that may prevent them from laying. Disturbances can come from well meaning observers who simply want to see this amazing event. The use of torches, camera flashes and moving in front of a female can all cause a turtle to head back to the ocean without laying her eggs.

Fortunately it is easy to learn ways to observe these amazing animals, without disturbing them. Reef Catchments, in partnership with Mackay and District Turtle Watch Association and Mackay Regional Council, will be holding a 'Turtle Talk and Beach Walk' at Ball Bay to give people the opportunity to learn more about marine turtles, and how to minimise the chance of disturbing them during this sensitive time.

The event will run on Saturday 15 November from 5.00 - 7.30pm (*meet at the park/campsite at the northern end of Ball Bay*) and will include a presentation about marine turtles, a free BBQ, and an evening beach walk. Spots are limited, so RSVP to secure a place. Email claire.bartron@reefcatchments.com or call 0429 155 841.

There will be a Coastcare Activity earlier in the day from 2.00 to 4.00pm, meeting at end of Buoro Street, Ball Bay, where keen volunteers can help to remove invasive weeds from the dunes.



They included people who work in our all-important tourism and sugar industries - the former of which would certainly benefit from a sealed road which, as many readers would know, has been talked about for decades, with no bitumen going down under the former Labor Government. In fact, the last time bitumen went down on this road, it was up around Surprise Siding and that was when my very good mate and now retiring Parliamentary colleague Vaughan Johnson was Main Roads Minister in the then Borbidge National Party (now LNP) Government. In the most recent Parliamentary sitting week, I again reminded the current Minister Scott Emerson of the need for some action on the Mt Ossa to Seaforth Road, especially with the tourism industry having so much potential in our local area - not forgetting that it also happens to be one of our Government's four economic pillars.

As a proud former Seaforth resident who still has relatives in the area, I'll continue to make representations to the Minister, on top of extending an invitation to him to personally drop into the Hibiscus Coast and see exactly what we have to offer and how the road fits into that. Furthermore, I look forward to tabling the actual petition in the Parliament and by the time that happens, we should have a more compelling case than ever to get some funding to finally get the ball rolling on sealing that much maligned gravel section.

Many thanks to everyone in the Community who has put pen to paper since I launched the petition at the 'Long Mile' turn-off on September 4 in front of a good crowd of residents, farmers, parents, Councillors and other key stakeholders.

HELP STOP REVEGETATION VANDALISM - COSTLY FOR ALL!



Recent destruction of trees and shrubs planted by volunteers at Ball Bay, under the guidance of Mackay Regional Council and Reef Catchments is an expense borne by all ratepayers. Those responsible may feel they are 'defending' a well-deserved view or their 'very own' coastal land. This selfish attitude is also quite at odds with the law, since stabilisation of dunes through revegetation is vital for the long-term protection of all beach front properties. Prevention is better than costly and often unsuccessful remediation!

Native vegetation on coastal dunes plays an important role in stabilising the surface against wind erosion and provides wildlife habitat. Coastal sand dunes, after reefs, are the second line of defence against wind and wave erosion in storm events. Where vegetation has been cleared or dunes lost to urban development, re-vegetation is essential to stabilise the area. Sadly there has been significant damage to the community re-vegetation site at Ball Bay. Precious resources, ratepayer money and volunteer time and effort have been wasted.

Penalties for damaging vegetation are now commensurate with the realised value of the dunes as coastal protection, and range from \$2,200 (20 penalty points) to \$44,000 (400 penalty points).



For the benefit of all our coastal dwellers, and in particular the Ball Bay community, please report any suspicious behaviour, or deliberate vegetation damage, to Mackay Regional Council on 1300 MACKAY (622529). Local community may be aware of the perpetrators – please work together to protect this beautiful coastline.

Cyclone season I called for a review into the effectiveness of Category 1 and 2 cyclone warnings after Cyclone Dylan caught people unawares in January this year, due to its unpredictability. Now that this review has been completed, changes have been made to improve our safety. Category 2 cyclone warnings will now be updated hourly and new guidelines this cyclone season will include additional warnings as tropical cyclones approach and cross the coast and flash warnings for unexpected change in the forecast track or intensity of a tropical cyclone.

Identity theft has increased in the digital age, and those who fall prey to it will spend at least 18 hours dealing with the consequences. Those who are victims of total "identity hijack" can spend more than 200 hours. Many victims don't know where to start when faced with the issue but a new free service will help with that process. The Federal Government is providing financial support to iDcare, which is a free and anonymous call service. iDcare is based out of the Sunshine Coast and you can find out more online at www.idcare.org or by calling 1300 432 273 (1300 IDCARE) Monday to Friday from 8am to 6pm.
