Unfortunately, the Seaforth area has continued to be subject to further property crime. There was even a break and enter committed in Seaforth during daytime hours. Suspects have been identified as being responsible for this offence and the matter is being investigated by Detectives.

These same suspects are responsible for committing numerous other property offences in the Mackay and Pioneer Valley area, and they remain a focus for all local police. This is a reminder that although the suspects don't reside in our immediate area, they often do travel long distances to commit crime.

Be mindful of securing your property and make it as difficult as possible for offenders to commit these offences. If you see any suspicious behaviour and activities in the area, then please report this to police.

If you wish to report suspicious behaviour or some other matter to police, you can call the Seaforth Police Beat on the above number; however I don't work twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, and a lot of the time when I am working I am out of the office and on the road.

If you contact the Police Beat number and I am not present a message will be played. This message advises you that if you or any other person is in danger or the incident is occurring now, then you should hang up the phone and call 000 immediately; **if the matter is not urgent you should contact Police Link on 131444 to report it.** You can also visit the QPS web page at www.police.qld.gov.au and report the matter on line.

Recently I have had people attempting to contact me via social media to report incidents or suspicious behaviour. I have also had people attempting to obtain my personal phone numbers so they could contact me, and some people are even contacting my wife via phone and social media outlets and attempting to report matters, hoping that she will pass the matters on. My wife is not employed by the Queensland Police Service and any attempts to report matters this way will not be actioned.

Police Link is a twenty-four hour a day service and is the preferred way of reporting matters to police. If it's a matter that I can assist with, or have knowledge of, Police Link will send me an email and when I am working next I will be able to call you back. Hopefully this helps you all should there be a need to contact police.

Members of the Seaforth Health & Welfare Group recently had the pleasure of helping one of their town members, **OLGA ETWELL**, celebrate this special milestone.

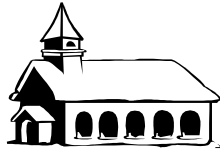

Superyacht anchorages will boost economy—The recent introduction of more superyacht anchorages in the Whitsundays is a welcome step on an issue I have lobbied for extensively over the past two years. I was very pleased to hear that amendments to the Whitsundays Plan of Management have been finalised, opening the way for 21 new superyacht anchorages in this world-class tourist destination. I have met with superyacht industry representatives on numerous occasions in the past two years and discussed

the case for change with

the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (GBRMPA) as well as the current and former Environment Minister.

One superyacht spending a week in port has the potential to inject \$50,000 into the local economy and support a number of small businesses.

When we see places like Noumea hosting 200 visits a year of a week or more each, we can appreciate the potential for the Whitsundays. Twenty-one new superyacht anchorages will be established at carefully selected locations with no corals or other sensitive habitats, providing further tourism opportunities and still protecting the area's core values. Hats off to Flynn Bushell and Ethan Leval who successfully campaigned for the Mackay Skate Park and Wheeled Sports Plaza Project which recently received \$1 million of federal funding.

Skates on as project becomes reality—I'm thrilled to announce the Mackay Skate Park and Wheeled Sports Plaza Project will become a reality after it beat hundreds of other entries from around Australia to win federal funding. A successful \$1 million application through the Building Better Regions Fund will get the \$2.2 million project off the ground, delivering a competition-standard skate park and wheeled sports plaza in partnership with the Police Citizens Youth Club. The skate park is the brainchild of Flynn Bushell and Ethan Leval, 12-year-old Mackay boys who last year organised a petition and addressed council on the need for a new city skate park. The state-of-the-art facility will cater for beginners through to advanced riders and provide an extra dimension to sports tourism in the region.

Support centre opens its doors—Feros Care had a great turnout to the recent official opening of its NDIS Local Area Coordination Service offices in Mackay. The organisation will support the rollout of the National Disability

Ring road contractor selected - We reached a major milestone on the Mackay Ring Road project recently, with CPB Contractors announced as the successful tenderers to build Stage 1 of the project. [Construction is due to start in coming weeks and continue for several years.](#) The project will remove heavy vehicles from the Mackay CBD and residential areas by providing a bypass for all vehicles without a destination in Mackay. This is a massive project for the region – we're going to see 13 new bridges being built as part of it, and I believe an average of 534 jobs will be supported during construction of the bypass. The \$497.3 million Bruce Highway – Mackay Ring Road (Stage 1) project is being funded by the Australian Government (\$397.9 million) and Queensland Government (\$99.4 million)



I was honoured to join with Mackay Regional Council CEO Craig Doyle, Feros Care CEO Jenenne Buckley and board member Dawn Stanfield at the Feros Care opening event.

New PBS listing gives hope to thousands—I'm pleased to say more than 4500 Australians will now benefit each year from the listing of a new medicine for lung and renal cancer on the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme (PBS). Nivolumab (sold as Opdivo®) is used to treat both locally advanced and metastatic stages of non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC) and Stage IV clear cell variant renal cell carcinoma (RCC). It is a significant new treatment which can extend life and improve quality of life for patients, and it is more effective and safer than current therapies. And at a cost to Government of around \$1.1 billion, it is one of the largest ever listings on the PBS. Nivolumab is a type of immunotherapy very different to conventional treatments such as chemotherapy and radiation, because it uses the body's own immune system to fight cancer. Without subsidy, the medicine would cost a patient more than \$130,000 per year.

Organ donation registration streamlined—If you've been intending to register for organ donation, take a minute or two and register via our new, streamlined online process. You could save lives or make a lifetime of difference for up to 10 people needing organ or tissue donation. Across the nation last year, 503 deceased and 267 living donors contributed to a record 1713 people receiving donated organs. About 1400 Australians are currently waiting for a transplant so we're asking people to register as soon as possible. Jump online, type in the words 'donatelifelife' and 'register', and sign up using the simple, five-line form.

Community funding up for grabs—I'm now taking expressions of interest for round 3 of the Stronger Communities programme (SCP), which provided assistance to 28 community groups in Mackay, the Whitsundays, Bowen, the Burdekin and Southern Townsville in the past two years. Stronger Communities provides assistance for not-for-profit groups to undertake capital projects and grants to cover 50 per cent of their project, and between \$2500 and \$20,000 is available for up to 20 organisations.
