I hope you all had a fantastic Christmas and New Year break. We had some hot but amazing weather, which made the Victor Creek boat ramp a very busy place to be. The good news is that during this period there were no reported thefts from the ramp area. The CCTV cameras are certainly having a positive impact on reducing crime at the ramp.

There was only one reported traffic crash that occurred on the Yakapari- Seaforth Road. Most of you would have seen the blue ute that had run off the road and collided with a tree. Thankfully no innocent road users or pedestrians were injured during the crash. The driver fled the scene, but he is known to police, and the investigation is continuing.

If you haven't already realised, the school term has commenced. The school speed zones come into effect from 8.00am to 9.00am and 2.30pm to 3.30pm on school days. Be mindful that our local school zone is 60Km/h but most other school zones in the Mackay area are 40km/h. Please be patient around the school bus and be mindful of school children entering and exiting from the bus and adjust your driving habits accordingly.

Recently local police and detectives from the Mackay Criminal Investigation Branch executed a search warrant in the area. One offender was charged with numerous offences. During the search police located a cannabis hydroponic setup, which included a large number of cannabis plants, drug utensils, and a pill press. The offender was charged with numerous drug offences, Break and Enter offences and Breach a Domestic Violence Order offence. The offender is due to front the Mackay Magistrate Court early in February.

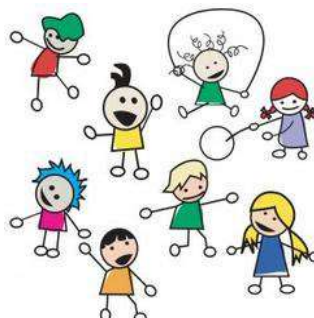

Bill had a long association with the Seaforth area dating back to the early 1970's when he and Bev had the Seaforth Post Office. At that time it was located in the house where Brian and Joyce Millard now live, next to the present post office .

Bill was another great community member. He was one of the trustees when the original Seaforth Country Club was formed. The need for sporting facilities was recognised, and this group showed remarkable foresight by acquiring a lease for recreational purposes on the land adjacent to the Bowls Club.

Bill was also a foundation member of the Seaforth Bowls Club who originally leased land from the Country Club. The Seaforth Bowls Club was officially opened in 1975 with Bill being the first treasurer of the club. He was an active member until he and Anna moved into town to live.

Back in the 1970's, Bill operated the Seaforth Bus Service which in later years ran escorted tours all around Australia. Many Seaforth and Mackay residents will have fond memories of these tours with Bill and Anna, especially the organised bus trips to various bowling clubs around the state.

Better mobile coverage on the way

Two locations in the area, Mount Ossa and Yalboroo, have been identified as priorities for new or improved mobile phone coverage under the Mobile Black Spot Program. This is good news not only for residents but all who travel the Bruce Highway between Mackay and the Whitsundays. Telecommunications companies will now put in tenders to deliver coverage to these areas.

Assistance for our lifesavers

LIFESAVING clubs around the country have received a \$5,000 boost over summer from the Liberal National Government to help them the great work they do in keeping people safe on our beaches. I know that the Mackay and Eimeo surf lifesaving clubs, manned by hard-working volunteers, will have no trouble putting those extra funds to good use to purchase either new rescue equipment or first aid and medical supplies.

Boost for key community services

A number of organisations in the Mackay region were successful in their applications for funding under the Stronger Communities Programme Round Three. One of those was the Mackay Kidney Support Network, which has received \$15,000 towards the cost of a new car to help them transport dialysis patients to and from treatment. The money couldn't have come at a better time as the group had a vehicle stolen just weeks before.

Bridging the Gregory

A new \$2.5 million two-lane bridge now spans the Gregory River on Dingo Beach Road, providing more reliable and safer road access in the region. It replaces an old single-lane timber bridge, and the work was undertaken thanks to a \$1.25 million grant under the Bridges Renewal Programme which matched funding provided by Whitsunday Regional Council.

Armistice Centenary We are now finalising applications for Armistice Day Centenary funding, which will assist community groups, schools and councils to celebrate this milestone in our nation's history. A total of \$50,000 was available for my electorate to conduct activities to commemorate the fact that a nation of fewer than five million people responded to the call to war with 416,809 enlistments. On November 11 this year we will remember the 60,000 who paid the ultimate sacrifice as well as 156,000 who were wounded, gassed or taken prisoner.
