There seems to be an ongoing and increasing problem with local community members being either caught by scammers online or through printed media. Most of the time these offenders are overseas, and once the money has been transferred you will never see it again.

It is great to see that some people are on top of these scams, and have been reporting these matters or simply deleting scamming or phishing emails, phone calls and text messages. Reporting for online scams can be made at the Australian Cybercrime Online Reporting Network www.acorn.gov.au

How can you reduce the chance of throwing your money away online for products which you will never receive?

Here's some ideas:

- It's sometimes easy to be anonymous on the internet – while there are many authentic buyers and sellers online, scammers are seeking and hoping for anonymity.
- Much effort will go into generating a fake internet site to appear as though it is an authentic online retail location – in other instances fake profiles will be generated by scammers and placed onto authentic buying/selling sites.
- We have all heard the warning words “If it's too good to be true ” Scammers will often advertise an item for sale at a very attractive price – hoping for as many responses as possible. *Heed this warning!!*
- A genuine red flag warning that you are dealing with a scammer when purchasing a product online relates to the requested method of payment. Potential victims will be asked to pay using a money order, pre-loaded money card or wire transfer. Any money forwarded in this fashion will *never* be seen again.
- NEVER provide your bank account details to an unknown seller online – no matter the circumstance.
- There is an additional long list of warning signs and prevention measures available for you through Scamwatch at www.scamwatch.gov.au (it is well worth a look).

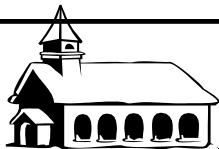

Funding gets Ozone off the ground

After much advocating for the project it was an absolute pleasure to recently announce a \$5.86 million investment in the Ozone Whitsundays Eco-Resort and Fauna Conservation Park at Riordanvale. Getting this project in motion is a major boost for the Whitsunday region in terms of tourism and jobs – it will deliver over 300 jobs for the region. This investment will provide yet another tourism draw card for the region, with the extensive grounds and

facilities not only catering to

those on holiday but the wider community for weddings, conferences, events and day spa visits.

Other projects in the region to benefit from the Coalition Government's Regional Jobs and Investment Package include:

- \$420,000 to Diacon Australia, Paget, for sustainable expansion of its supply of plastic conveyor improvement system products;
- \$249,839 to Linked Group Services, for a new headquarters in Paget;
- \$150,000 for Mackay Canegrowers for training of farmers in irrigation for intensive cropping;
- \$1.6 million for D&T Hardchrome, Paget, for a world-class hard chrome electroplating and finishing facility in the Bowen Basin region.

Sparking a love of languages

I'm hoping a life-long interest in language learning will be ignited for Mackay and Whitsundays children through a new program that's being rolled out this year. About 570 children at 14 preschools in the Mackay and Whitsundays region will be given the opportunity to learn a second language through the Liberal National Government's Early Learning Languages Australia (ELLA) program. Children at Whitsunday Anglican School Kindergarten, Emmanuel Kindergarten Mackay, St Brendan's Catholic Kindergarten, My School Childcare and Kindergarten, Cannonvale Kidz Early Learning Centre and C&K Beaconsfield Community Kindergarten will be learning Japanese; children at Mackay Child Care Kindergarten, Kidzplay & Learning Centre, Goodstart Early Learning Mackay Macalister Street and Mackay Kindergarten & Preschool will be learning Spanish; children at Community Kids Glenella and South Mackay Kindergarten will be learning French; children at Little Geckos Early Learning Centre Cannonvale will be learning Indonesian; and children at C&K Whitsunday Community Kindergarten will be learning Chinese. Exposure to another language and culture can have significant benefits on children from a young age – it expands their horizons and opens up exciting opportunities around the world when they reach the workforce. Greater protection against deadly flu

Two new flu vaccines are available to Dawson residents aged 65 years and over – and they're free of charge. The federally-funded vaccines are aimed squarely at saving lives this flu season. More than 90% of the 1100 flu-related deaths in Australia last year were people aged over 65. The new vaccines – Fluvad® and Fluzone High Dose® – are available now and have been specifically made for seniors, as their immune systems respond less effectively to vaccines. The new three-strain vaccines work in over 65s by generating a strong immune response, and are more effective for this age group in protecting against influenza. It's recommended flu vaccinations are received before the peak flu season begins in June.

Bring forth big ideas

If you're harbouring big business ideas, now is the time to bring them to fruition. The Regional Growth Fund is open for applications and we're looking for big thinkers with plans to shape the future of our region. The \$272 million fund will support major projects (over \$20 million) in regional, rural and remote areas that deliver long-term economic benefits and take advantage of the region's natural economic strengths. Initial applications close on April 27. The Coalition Government will invest a minimum of \$10 million toward each successful infrastructure project, representing a maximum of 50% of project costs. 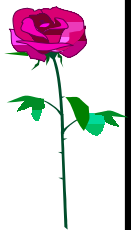
