Hi everyone, I hope you all had a safe and enjoyable Easter Holiday. The threat of a cyclone and some poor weather certainly limited the number of people visiting the area over the school holiday period.

For the most part everybody behaved. However, Traffic Infringement Notices were issued for offences such as speeding, and people were also charged for drink driving and unlicensed driving. The good news is that there were no reported traffic crashes in the area during the holiday period.

There has been some minor crime in the area of late. Some fuel cans were stolen from the Seaforth Pines Outdoor Education Centre. Offenders smashed and forced their way into a locked storage area and left with the stolen fuel and containers. Over the Easter long weekend the Whitsunday Water Police conducted patrols of the waterways and boat ramps around the area. Even with the poor weather they wrote numerous Marine Infringement Notices for offences in relation to not carrying the prescribed safety equipment, registration offences and licensing offences. One offender also supplied a positive alcohol breath test and action for being over the general alcohol limit has been taken with the offender being sent to court.

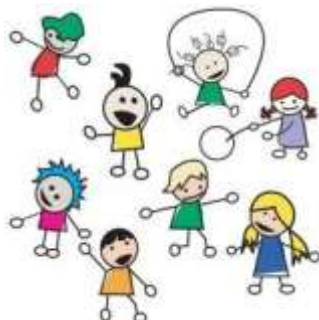

### New bus helps those in need

Mackay Community Visitors Association in West Mackay is bussing clients to important appointments and social events in comfort. The organisation was given a \$20,000 boost to buy a new bus under the Stronger Communities Programme. Mackay Community Visitors Association is a non-profit volunteer organisation providing assistance to people who need a helping hand for a whole range of reasons; they may be elderly, have poor mobility, limited family support and they might be in an aged care facility or living in their own home. Many require wheelchairs or other mobility aids. Mackay Community Volunteers helps people by providing a door-to-door transport service for such things as medical appointments, shopping visits or social outings. Under the funding, the new bus was fitted with a wheelchair loader.

### \$4,300 for Iona West Men's Shed

Well done to members of the Iona West Men's Shed who have secured a grant of \$4,343 from the Liberal National Government to purchase tools and equipment under the Government's National Shed Development Programme. The Iona West Men's Shed offers great benefits to any local men who need a bit of space and some friendly, easy-going company. Members will use the government grant to purchase tools and equipment and to undertake projects and

training. The Iona West Men's Shed or 'The Den' as it's also known, is a well-established gathering place for men in West Mackay and provides the right environment to open up to mates.

### More mobile phone coverage

Mount Ossa and Yalboroo will receive funding for Telstra macro base stations, to improve mobile phone coverage to the north and south-west of Mount Ossa, and at Yalboroo and to the north and south of Paskins Road. The new coverage will boost safety for those travelling along the Bruce Highway between Mackay and Proserpine, and open doors for small businesses and the community, enabling them to access the same mobile services as those in major cities.

Funding comes from the Priority Locations round of the Coalition Government's \$220 million Mobile Black Spot Program. These two priority mobile black spot areas were identified late last year. The Coalition's Mobile Black Spot program is already delivering new or improved coverage along the Bowen Developmental Road between Bowen and Collinsville, and another mobile tower will be built at Woodwark in the Whitsundays this year. Construction of the new towers will be under way soon with the first base stations completed later this year. ### Road safety boost

Community input has helped identify road areas in need of upgrade, and as a result the Coalition Government is set to invest \$1.7 million into three Mackay projects under the 2018-19 Black Spot Program. Mackay roads to receive Black Spot funding are:

- \$641,000 to install a single lane roundabout at the intersection of Victoria and Tennyson streets;
- \$615,000 to install a single land roundabout at the intersection of Victoria and Lawson streets; and
- \$446,000 to install traffic signals at the intersection of Bridge Road and Goldsmith streets.
