How good has the weather been of late? It's a fantastic time of year, and this great weather means that many people are taking advantage of it, and are getting out and exploring our local waters and islands. Queensland Parks and Wildlife Services, Queensland Boating and Fisheries, and Queensland Water Police officers have all had a strong presence in the area lately, and this will continue.

If you're out in your boat make sure you conduct all safety checks prior to getting on the water. Regularly check the condition of your life jackets. Check that you are carrying the required type and that there is one per person. Check the expiry dates of your EPIRB and flares. Ensure your boat is registered and you are displaying the current label and registration number and letters. Also remember the drink driving limit is the same as for driving a car.

Make sure you know your size and bag limits for fish and crabs, and you are familiar with the Marine Parks Green Zones in the area. There have been numerous people being caught out and fined recently for a variety of different offences, and unfortunately many of the people are local. Local recreational fishermen have also been caught out tampering with crab pots that don't belong to them.

With the change of season please be mindful of different conditions on the road. Turning your lights on during the early morning and late afternoon twilight times and for fog is a great start, and just another way you can travel safely on the road. Having your lights on early allows other vehicles to see you quicker and just may prevent a traffic crash.

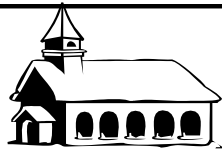

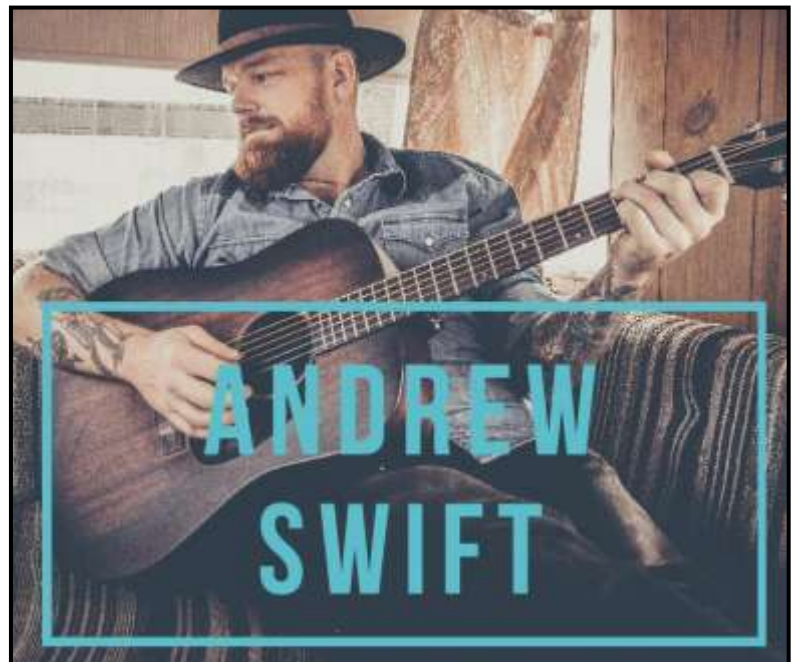

Entrepreneur not sitting idle

harvesting, condition-monitoring device for use inside conveyor rollers. The Smart-Idler senses and transmits key indicators of roller failure to operation-control, so that intelligent, pre-emptive maintenance can be safely undertaken, in turn eliminating unplanned conveyor downtime due to failure. The grant will support Vayeron in taking steps like trials and market testing, bringing them closer to launching in local and international markets. Doctors' forum

The region's GPs met with myself and Minister for Rural Health, Senator Bridget McKenzie, at a forum in Mackay recently to discuss a range of local GP-related issues. Topics covered included the need to attract more doctors to the region, and increased accessibility of bulk-billing services. Dr Melissa McCann, from Whitsunday Family Practice, was among those who attended. The \$550 million allocated in our latest federal budget for a Stronger Rural Health Strategy will address a number of issues facing health professionals in rural practices including incentives for practices to employ multidisciplinary teams to support GPs, more targeted bulk billing and incentives to attract more junior doctors into towns like Mackay.
